DAY 1: 10 OCTOBER 2013

ARRIVE BARCELONA (2 NIGHTS)

Welcome to the start of the tour in Barcelona, Spain's most dazzling cosmopolitan city. Settle into your hotel till we meet for an arranged dinner. Soak up the atmosphere and meet Jacqueline and your new travel companions and our travel director. Relax and unwind after check-in or take to the streets and explore the vibrant capital of Catalonia. Welcome dinner.

DAY 2: 11 OCTOBER 2013

BARCELONA - SIGHTSEEING & FREE TIME

Today, do some sightseeing with your expert Local Guide. Visit the spectacular Gaudi's 'La Sagrada Familia', an ongoing church project emulating medieval spires. There is a working studio underneath the church where you can see the original Gaudi models. Climb the towers, marvel at the nativity facade, and the passion facade. Gaudi used real people and animals for the sculptures and even bodies from the morgue such was his attention to detail.

After we visit another Gaudi project, Park Guell, where we see the master has turned his hand to his distinctive style of landscape gardening. Then on to the twittering bird market of Las Ramblas. Fantastic shopping along Las Ramblas and quite a few small art galleries worth exploring. Then visit the Picasso Museum. You are free this afternoon to shop in the trendy boutiques of Sitges. You might also consider visiting Museo d'art contemporani.

DAY 3: 12 OCTOBER 2013

BARCELONA – MADRID (3 NIGHTS)

Early morning we will leave Barcelona for a full day of travel to Spain's capital, Madrid. With a population of 5.5 million, this city throbs with life, and was the seat of culture, wealth and imperial

glory. It was also Spain's most artistic centre during the Golden Age. These days it's the city of opportunity for Spaniards. Shiny skyscrapers rise from ancient plazas. Let us begin our tour of this fascinating city.

City tour on the way to the hotel including the Cibeles Fountain, the Gran Via, the Peurta del Sol and the monument to Cervantes at Plaza de Espana. Enjoy an arranged dinner.

DAY 4: 13 OCTOBER 2013

MADRID - SIGHTSEEING

Visit the Botanical Garden (Real Jardin Botanico) with a collection of over 30,000 different species of plants from South America followed by a visit to the famous Prado Museum. Museo del Prado is home to a large collection of works by Velasquez and works by Titian, Botticelli, Goya, and Rubens. It's 7,000 art pieces are the result of hundreds of years of Bourbon art collecting famous for its 12-17th century collections.

This evening, you might be tempted by Madrid's nightlife, where the locals dine late and enjoy the openair cafés and vibrant atmosphere until the early hours!

DAY 5: 14 OCTOBER 2013

MADRID - SIGHTSEEING AND FREE TIME

This morning visit Buen Retiro Gardens, a second home for the people of Madrid. Here is a large public park full of life. Parque del Buen Retiro, once the preserve of kings and queens is now a popular place to stroll, relax, and take in the marble monuments, elegant greenery, and ornamental structures. Grab a coffee and write your postcards or engage in a contemplative water colour with Jacqueline. The rest of the day will be yours to enjoy.

DAY 6: 15 OCTOBER 2013

MADRID - VALDEPENAS - GRANADA

Your journey continues through the wine producing centre of Valdepeñas, where you will visit a bodega and taste some of the local wines. Then its across La Mancha, where your Travel Director tells the tale of Don Quixote. Finish the day with wonderful views of the Sierra Nevada Mountains while enjoying dinner at your hotel.

DAY 7: 16 OCTOBER 2013

GRANADA - MARBELLA

This morning your Local Guide takes you on a visit to the incredible Alhambra Palace, built in the 14th century and a magnificent example of Moorish architecture. Enjoy the water gardens of Generalife the

royal summer palace as well as the Lion Court. The view over the surrounding hills and town is spectacular.

Admire the ancient filigree, quiet courtyards and colossal walls. In the afternoon, arrive on the famous Costa del Sol.

DAY 8: 17 OCTOBER 2013

MARBELLA – FEZ (2 NIGHTS)

We travel along the Mediterranean coast to Tarifa, then cross to North Africa by ferry. A memorable drive past the Rif Mountains brings you to the Imperial city of Fez, the country's second-largest city in Morocco. Expect great sights, food and history. Fez connects the old caravan routes of the Saharan Empires like Timbuktu and Takrur with the Atlantic and the Mediterranean shipping lanes.

Hotel: Riad Sheherazade (confirmed)

DAY 9: 18 OCTOBER 2013

FEZ – SIGHTSEEING AND FREE TIME

Your expert Local Guide takes you on a morning sightseeing tour of Fez, the former capital of Morocco. Explore the médina, one of the largest thriving medieval centres in the world, (old Fez) with its warren of narrow streets, lanes and covered bazaars bursting with aromatic food stands, craft workshops, mosques, and an endless parade of people. We visit Bab al Makina where some of the finest carpet weavers in Morocco work, then we visit the Souk Al Henna, which has the finest display of pottery. Spend the rest of the day seeing the sights of your choice, Dar Batha Museum, Bou Jeloud Gardens, The Attarine Spice markets with the dainty fragrance of musk, henna, and oil soap, visit a Hammam (hot baths) or dine later at the La Maison Bleue.

DAY 10: 19 OCTOBER 2013

FEZ – MIDELT - ERFOUD

Follow the old caravan trail south. Stop in Midelt, a market town set in the high plains between the Middle and High Atlas mountain ranges. Here we will visit Kasbah Myriem, a carpet and embroidery workshop run by Franciscan nuns and the Monastery of Our Lady of the Atlas. Continue along the palmfringed Ziz Valley, famous for date cultivation, to the Tafilalt oasis on the edge of the Sahara Desert.

Your day ends in Erfoud, where beautiful views across the shimmering Sahara have made this a popular location with filmmakers.

Hotel: Chergui Kasbah or similar

DAY 11: 20 OCTOBER 2013

ERFOUD - SKOURA - OUARZAZATE

Via Skoura, see mudbrick kasbahs built into the cliffs and the incredible oasis of 1,000 palms where under a green canopy produce a 15 mile patchwork of garden plots are watered by a centuries old watering system involving locks, levers, and canals. Our guide brings us stories of the ancient spice and gold caravans route bringing the past to life.

We continue through part of the Todra Gorge and cut through the mountains - this is one of the most dramatic views in the country! Follow the route of a thousand Kasbahs to Ouarzazate. (BB)

Hotel: Le Berbere Palace or similar

DAY 12: 21 OCTOBER 2013

OUARZAZATE

Today see the sights during your orientation tour of this city, which has been the setting for a number of famous movies including Lawrence of Arabia, Cleopatra and Gladiator. Rest of the day is at leisure.

DAY 13: 22 OCTOBER 2013

OUARZAZATE - AIT BEN HADDOU - MARRAKESH (3 NIGHTS)

This morning visit the Atlas Film Corporation Studios, where a string of movies have been filmed and Kasbah Taourirt, one of the most impressive of its kind in Morocco classified as a historical monument giving tribute to the Glaoui.

Visit Ait Ben Haddou in the High Atlas Mountains, Continue through the Tizi-n-Tichka Pass to Marrakesh - the 'Red City'.

Like many other former imperial cities in Morocco, Marrakesh is comprised of an old fortified city - the médina - and an adjacent modern city. Marrakesh is home to Morocco's largest traditional market ('souk') where you might like to do some shopping. This evening experience traditional Moroccan cuisine.

Hotel: Riad Batoul (confirmed)

DAY 14: 23 OCTOBER 2013

MARRAKESH - SIGHTSEEING AND FREE TIME

Your expert Local Guide takes you on a morning sightseeing tour to Jardin Majorelle a gem of a museum dedicated to original owner Frenchman and landscape painter Jacques Majorelle who also cultivated the garden in 1924. The garden is home to 300 plant spices from 5 continents whilst the museum houses. Majorelle's elegant southern Moroccan paintings plus rotating exhibitions. The art deco villa exhibits benefactors Yves Saint Laurent's collection of Morrocan decorative arts. Spot the colorful African

songbirds in the garden. Enjoy the surrounding decorative garden with its tiled features. The art Deco Villa exhibits benefactors Yves Saint Laurent's collection of Moroccan decorative art.

See Menara Gardens with its reflective pools and royal olive groves and a 19th century pavilion.

DAY 15: 24 OCTOBER 2013

MARRAKESH - SIGHTSEEING AND FREE TIME

Today you will visit the Bahia Palace, its grand and petitcot yards, and the harem that once housed 4 wives and 24 concubines. Afterwards visit the Museum of Moroccan Arts – Dar Si Said – Later enjoy a drink at Terasse Des Epices before returning to your hotel.

DAY 16: 25 OCTOBER 2013

MARRAKESH - CASABLANCA - RABAT

Perhaps most famous for the film bearing its name, Casablanca is Morocco's largest city as well as a major port. View the Hassan II Mosque during your informative sightseeing tour with an expert Local Guide. See the maze of twisted streets around the Kasbah. Continue to the capital city Rabat, where you see the Mausoleum, Mosque and Royal Palace.

Hotel: Golden Tulip Farah Rabat Hotel or similar

DAY 17: 26 OCTOBER 2013

RABAT – SEVILLE (2 NIGHTS)

See Cape Spartel on your cruise across the Straits of Gibraltar to the Spanish mainland. Note the breathtaking scenery on your drive through the vineyards of Jerez, the world capital of sherry. This evening experience the fiery Spanish passion at a flamenco show!

Hotel: Melia Lebreros or similar

DAY 18: 27 OCTOBER 2013

SEVILLE SIGHTSEEING

Meet your Local Guide for a sightseeing tour of Seville. Our guide will unveil the fascinating history of Seville, as we explore the fabulous winding streets. View the Bell Tower of the Giralda, see the tiled fountains, pavilions and lush palms in the Maria Luisa Park, centre piece to the 1929 World Fair. It was built in a Moorish style and is famous for its landscape design including half a mile of fountains, ponds and pavilions and lush plantings. Walk through the imposing Plaza de España. Then visit Alcazar, the oldest royal palace still in use in Europe. And a Moorish and Catholic fantasy palace once the residence of the king and queen of Spain set in richly scented gardens including Jardines de Murillo.

Why not try Seville's famous tapas along with a Tinto de verano (red wine and orange soda) or a sangria?

Seville's pulse and passion can be felt in the Flamenco dance, guitar and songs expressing the lives of the Andalucian people. It originated with the gypsies and you will know it by the rhythmic clamping, intricate fretwork on the guitar, throaty wailing, rapid foot tapping, and swirling dancers.

This evening is at leisure.

La Marcha or bar hopping could be fun afterwards to gain an insight into why Seville has a reputation for hot nightlife. The action gets going around midnight. Jac's curfew for happy travelers is 1 am! If not, shhhh and make sure you have a good alarm clock!

DAY 19: 28 OCTOBER 2013

SEVILLE - LISBON

Lisbon is a city that glows with its history via bronze statues, roman arches, a towering 12 th century castle, red roofed houses, time worn walls and charming cobblestone streets. Contrast his with cutting edge fashion, flourishing art and music scenes, and a pounding nightlife and we have a magnificent sensory cocktail on our hands.

Lisbon is also a colourful city with a rich maritime history. Visit the Monument to the Discoveries, commemorating the maritime expansion of Portugal and the men who sallied forth fearlessly in search of fame and fortune, including Henry the Navigator, Vasco da Gama and Pedro Álvares Cabral, who discovered Brazil. Enjoy a nice evening dinner in the fascinating Barrio Alto, with its narrow streets and lively restaurants and bar atmosphere followed by a moving and soulful performance of the world famous Fado. (BB HD)

Hotel: Olissippo Marques de Sa or similar

DAY 20: 29 OCTOBER 2013

LISBON – SINTRA – OPORTO (2 NIGHTS)

This morning visit Berardo Collection Museum, where a fine arts collection of the 20th century and early 21st century, especially European and American art is housed surrounded by a beautiful garden. Say good bye to Lisbon as we spend the rest of the day at Sintra, home to the ancient castles and fairy tale palaces. Sultans, monarchs, and wealthy noblemen were drawn to its mystic beauty over the centuries and have left a trail of opulence and grandeur. Prepare for the most delightful sensory overload. We continue to Porto where we will spend the night.

Keats once wrote an ode to the splendid sprawling vineyard vistas of Porto, Portugal's second largest city overlooks the Douro river. Porto is famous for its port. and today we visit a cellar door and taste the local product from the vats and enjoy a local explaining the history.

Then head to Oporto.

DAY 21: 30 OCTOBER 2013

OPORTO - SIGHTSEEING AND FREE TIME

See the remarkable bridges across the Douro River, the Vila Nova de Gaia wine stores and the Baroque Church of St. Francis. Visit the Stock Exchange with its Arabian Hall then experience a wine tasting at a port cellar. Later visit Museum Serralves. This world-class museum displays cutting-edge international contemporary art. Tonight, join your Travel Director and fellow travelers for a

Farewell Dinner.

DAY 22: 31 OCTOBER 2013

OPORTO - DEPART LISBON
