Day 1. Tuesday 22 May '07 ARRIVE LONDON, OPTIONAL RIVER CRUISE TO KEW GARDENS

Day 5. Saturday 26 May, '07 BREAKFAST IN LONDON, DINE IN PARIS!

This morning board the Eurostar train and travel first class underneath the English Channel to Paris. On arrival take an orientation sightseeing tour viewing the best known sights of Paris including the Eiffel Tower, Champs Elysees, Arc de Triomphe, Notre Dame and the Tuileries Gardens. A wonderful Parisian dining experience is included tonight.

Day 6. Sunday 27 May, '07 AN "ARTY" DAY IN PARIS & SOME FREE TIME

Visit a quaint 19th century art supplies shop in the St Germain arrondissement. Its loaded to the gunnels with the fabulous and the unusual, including copper bound paint brushes, enticing arrays of paints, pastels, canvases and sketch books. If Jacqueline has put you in the mood for art you may be tempted here - a beautiful shop just to enjoy. A stroll over the river Seine brings us to the Louvre, the most famous art museum in the world. The rest of the day is at your leisure. Why not come sketching at the Ile de La Cite, the small island in the middle of the Seine and enjoy the late afternoon light on the world's most romantic city? Or go shopping, take a boat ride or take time to relax even more.

99 9. Monday 28 May, '07 MONET'S GARDENS, GIVERNY & DOMAINE DE BEAUREGARD

Today we visit the gardens created by Monet at Giverny, situated along the banks of the Seine. These gardens were the inspiration for the famous canvases of water-lilies, weeping willows, the Japanese bridge and wisteria. There will be ample time to picnic and relax, soak in the splendour, browse the small shops of Giverny and visit the American Museum showcasing the works of American Impressionists that came to France to paint. From here visit Domaine de Beau Regard, a castle of the 17th century with an extraordinary two hectare flowered kitchen garden. Evening free.

Day 8. Tuesday 29 May, '07 THE PARKS AND GARDENS OF PARIS & FREE AFTERNOON

Paris has many parks and gardens, large and small. Today see several of these gardens starting with the elegant Parc de Bagatelle, created in 1777 for Marie Antoinette and known for its marvelous rose garden. We also visit historic Parc des buttes. Return to your hotel for a free afternoon.

Day 9. Wednesday 30 May, '07 BREAKFAST IN PARIS, EXPLORE

This morning you will be transferred from your hotel to the airport for your flight to Florence. On arrival enjoy a half day sightseeing tour of Florence, renowned as the birthplace of Italian art and associated with such greats as Michelangelo and Leonardo Da Vinci. Your tour reveals the magnificent Duomo Cathedral, the Palazzo Vecchio and the famous Ponte Vecchio which crosses the Arno and will take you to the Piazzale Michelangelo from where a superb panoramic view of the city can be gained. Settle and relax as we have four nights in this once medieval and magical city. The rest of the day and evening are yours. Go for coffees, sample mouthwatering gelati or shop till you drop.

Day 10. Thursday 31 May, '07 THE PITTI PALACE, FLORENCE & FREE TIME

Today we visit the Pitti Palace. In the grounds of the Pitti Palace are the Boboli Gardens. The Medici bought the Pitti Palace in 1550. The gardens only became famous when they became the property of the Medici. Tribolo, the designer of the Boboli, created a masterpiece of landscape architecture. His design was used for all the royal gardens in Europe including the Versailles. Jacqueline will bring sketching materials in case you are in the mood. The rest of the day is yours. Enjoy the dilemma of choosing where to eat for dinner. Soak up the ambience and the local cuisine, and the evening parade of beautifully dressed locals.

Day 11. Thursday 1 June, '07 ENJOY THE ART OF THE ACCADEMIA FLORENCE

This morning enjoy a guided tour of the Accademia. After the tour there will be time to explore the museum at leisure. Afternoon for independent activities. Optional art activity with Jacqueline basing ourselves at an atmospheric bar or café. Your correspondence can be a work of art to be framed later. Wax lyrical over a glass of wine. Create fun postcards to send home. Jacqueline will bring all materials for no mess action!

Day 12. Friday 2 June '07 A DAY TO PLEASE YOURSELF

Today has been set aside for you to fit in other delights of your choosing. There is an optional tour to the Uffizi Gallery. Florence is famous for leather, linen and lace, shoes and fashion. Pucci, Gucci, Prada, Ferragamo and Armani all have major fashion boutiques here as does Sergio Rossi for shoes. Make a day of exploring on foot the many historic piazzas and ancient churches. Soak it up as tomorrow we leave for Rome!

Day 13. Saturday 3 June, '07 BREAKFAST IN FLORENCE & VISIT THE VATICAN IN ROME

Travel from Florence to Rome by touring coach. On arrival, transfer to the Vatican for a tour that includes the Vatican Museum and Sistine Chapel, with Michelangelo's beautiful painted ceiling. The rest of the day is yours to explore this magnificent city.

Stay 14. Sunday 4 June, '07 FROM THE ROMAN EMPIRE TO THE VIA VENETO & FAREWELL DINNER

Once the capital of a great empire, Rome retains much of its grandeur. This morning enjoy a sightseeing tour of the city including the Roman Forum and the Colosseum and the chic Via Veneto and Piazza Navone, the Spanish steps and of course the Trevi fountain. In the afternoon visit the Borghese Gallery at the Villa Borghese Pinciana, a former villa housing a substantial collection of paintings, sculpture and antiquities begun by Cardinal Scipone Borghese, the nephew of Pope Paul V. The Borghese Gardens cover one third of Northern Rome and include a 17th century Italian Garden. Sketching opportunity for those interested. Regroup for a wonderful meal which is our farewell dinner.

Day 15. 5th June, '07 DEPARTING ROME

Breakfast in Rome then transfer to the airport for our flight home. Tissues anyone?
